metro system. Adventure World, an amusement park was next for the new students as they split in groups and scattered across the park. After N5O, everyone was exhausted, but many good memories linger.







# Bonding With Brothers & Sisters






### Homecoming Football Game


# A Royal Moment





## A Quarter of our Lives




