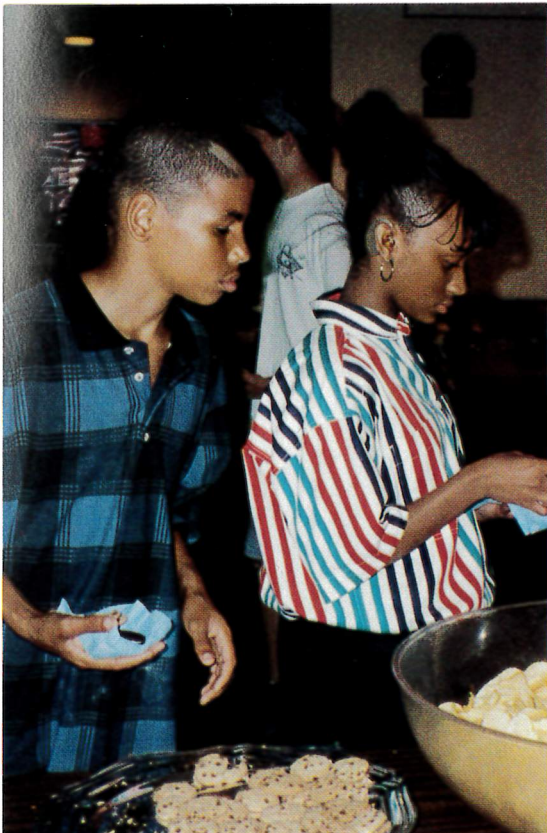

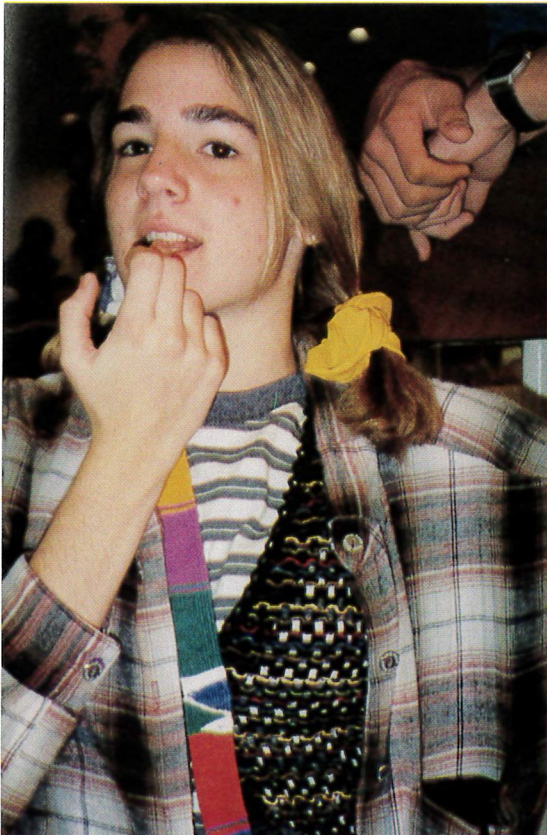

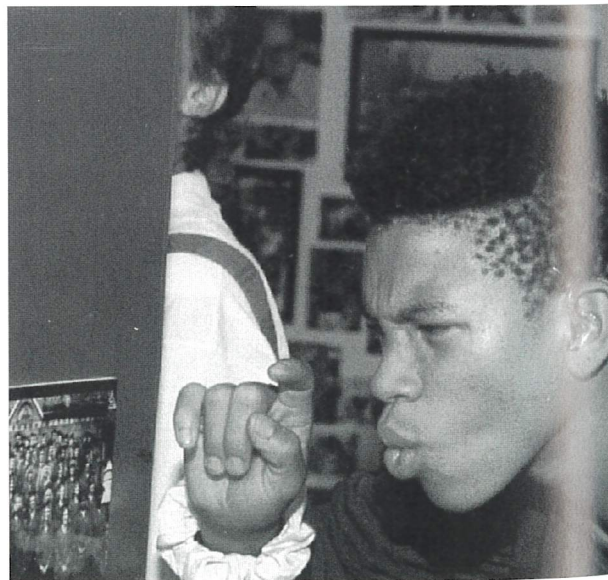

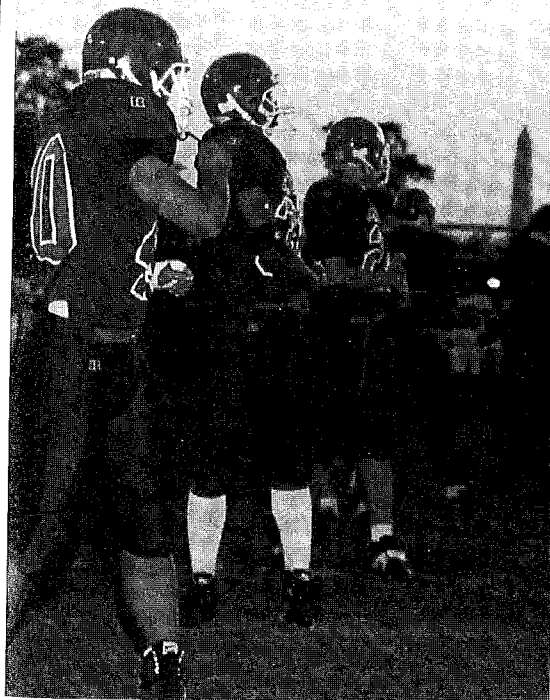

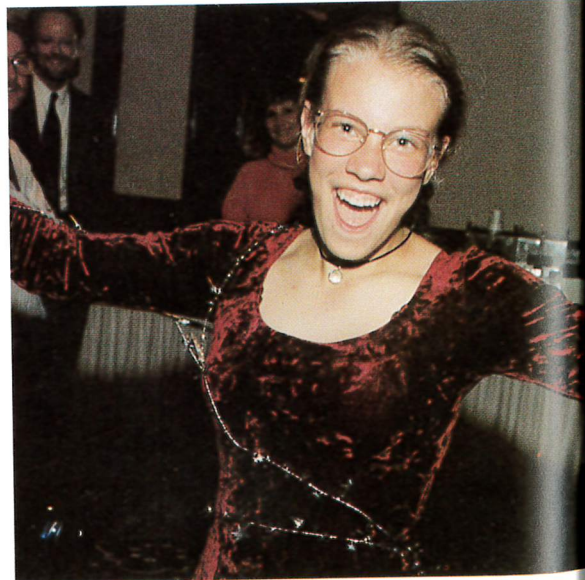

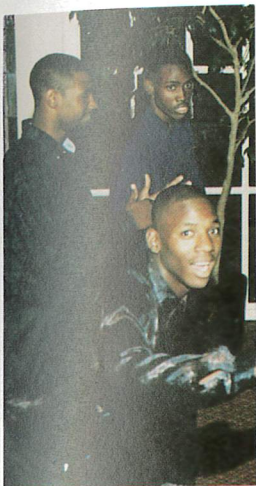

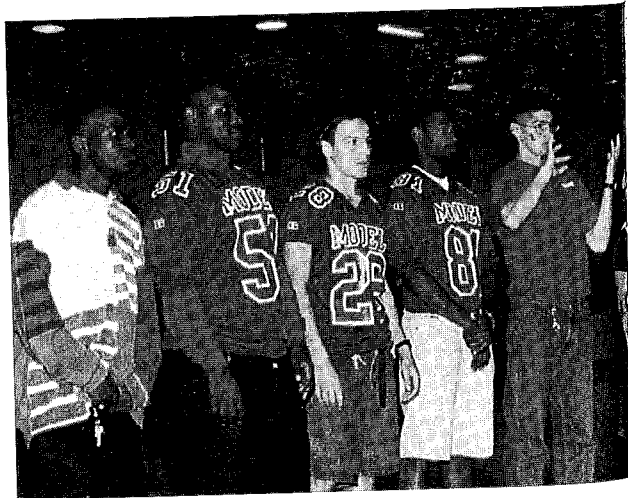
A Royal Moment

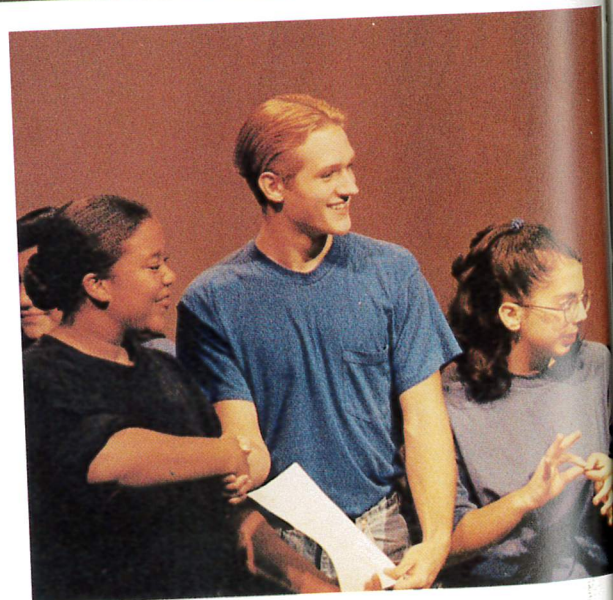

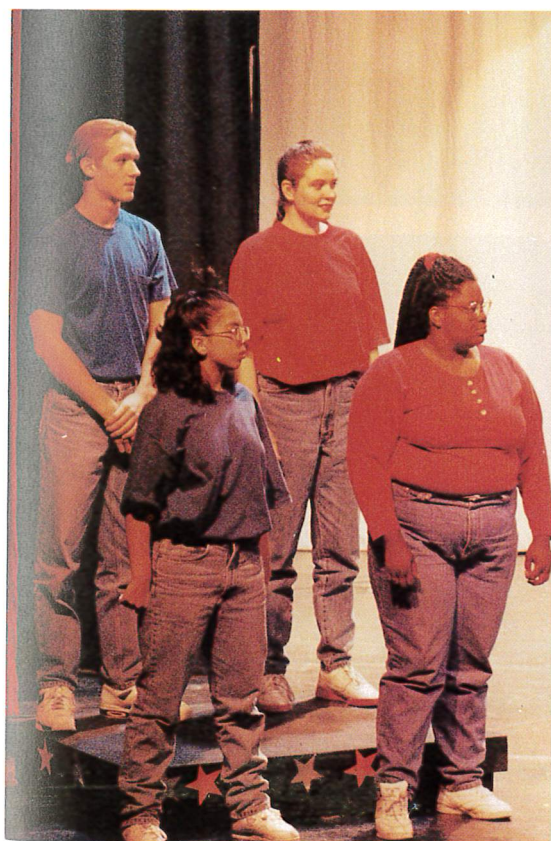

A Quarter of our Lives

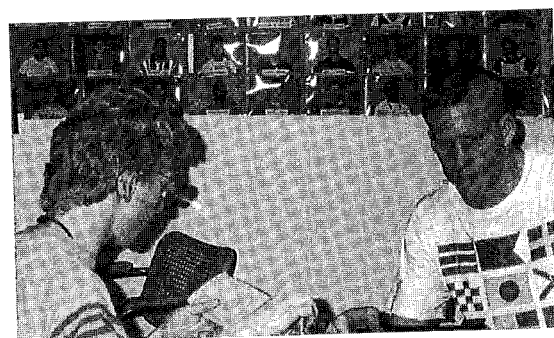
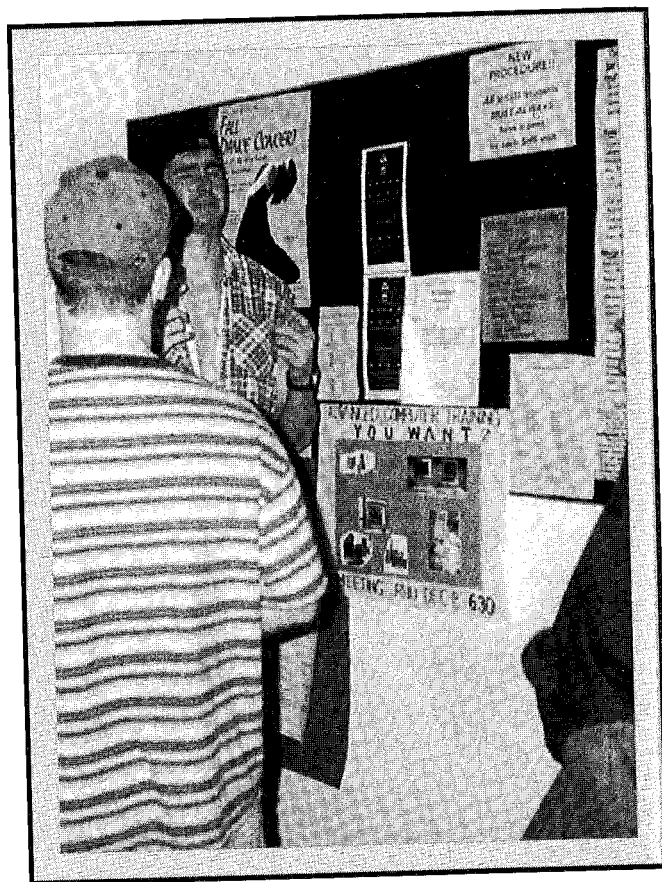

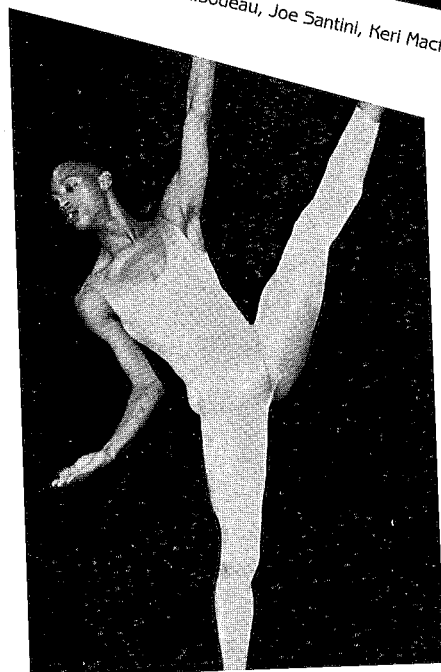

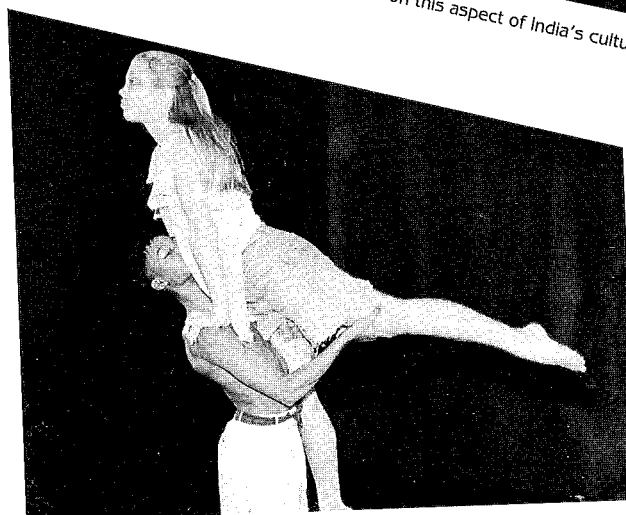

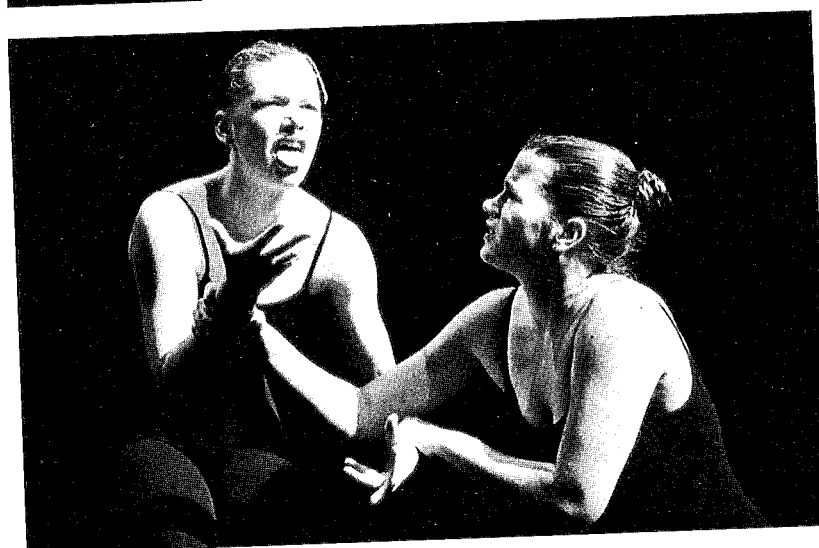

A Look Back

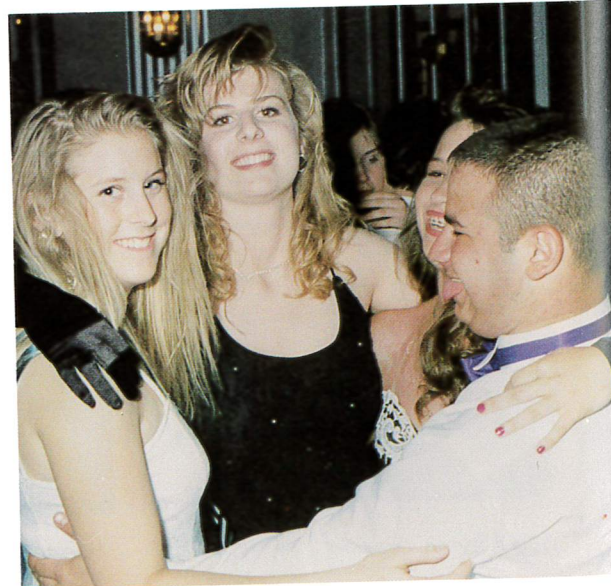

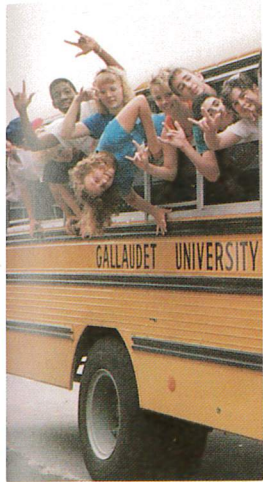

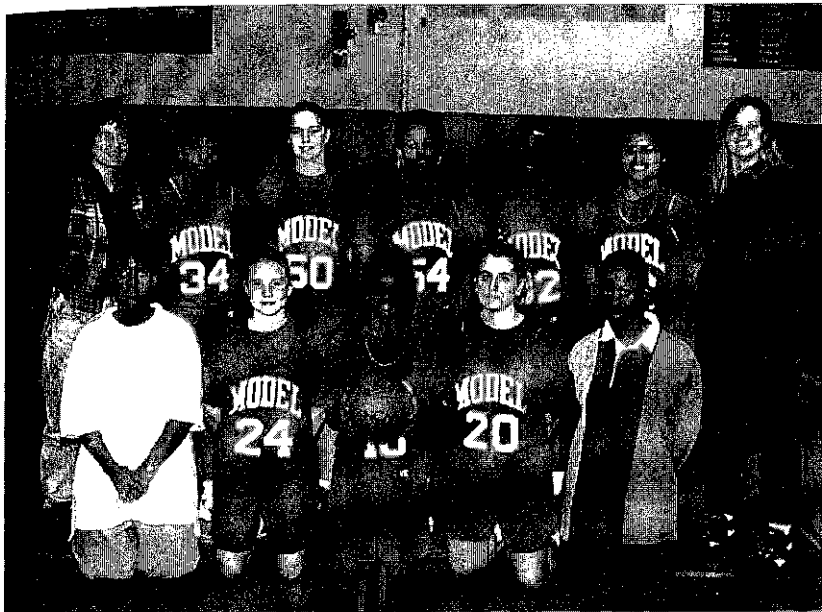

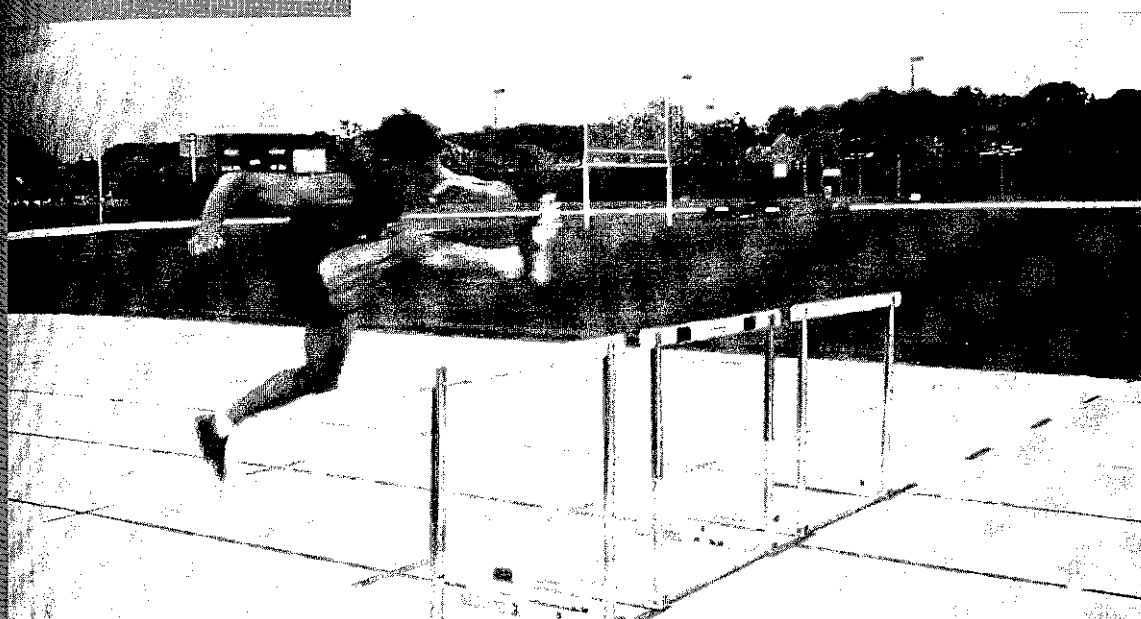

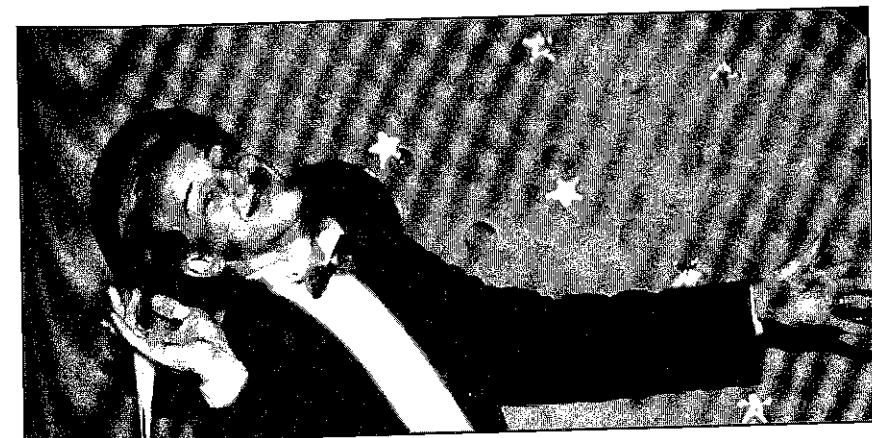

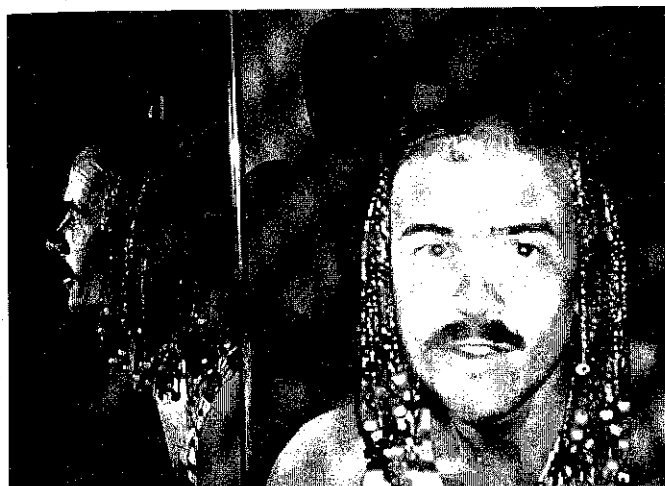
